
Who are we?

TRUenergy is one of Australia's largest energy businesses with retail energy customers across the country. We also own and operate a number of energy generation facilities, including wind farms.

In July this year, we took over management of the Waterloo and Cathedral Rocks wind farms in South Australia. Together, these wind farms produce enough clean energy to power 81,000 homes.

Demand for clean energy is growing. As a result, we are now looking to build new wind farms, including the Stony Gap wind farm, near Burra.

Community Information Day

Noise

Do wind farms make noise? Can noise from wind farms make you sick? These are questions we are asked by people we talk to every day.

There is a lot of incorrect information about wind farms and noise about. The truth is wind farms in Australia cannot be built unless they meet strict noise laws set by the South Australian government.

Wind farms do make noise. Noise from wind farms however, cannot be substantially louder than everyday sounds people living nearby are used to hearing.

Wind farms also do not produce unique sounds or pressure patterns.

They produce sounds just like other manmade machinery. Scientific studies have found no evidence that these sounds can have a negative effect on human health.

Recently, the EPA measured noise levels at our Waterloo wind farm. The wind farm was found to be compliant with the South Australian noise regulations.

Stony Gap Update

TRUenergy has recently lodged an application with the Goyder Regional Council, seeking approval to build the Stony Gap wind farm, near Burra.

If built, the Stony Gap wind farm will deliver enough clean energy to power nearly 77,000 homes and will inject around \$15.5 million into the local Mid North community. The new wind farm will also create new jobs for local skilled workers.

Our application will be assessed by the Council's independent Development Assessment Panel, who will seek community feedback on our proposal and decide if the proposed wind farm meets all planning and environmental requirements.

We will continue to update you with information on our Stony Gap wind farm proposal as it moves through the development consent process.
