3.1	<p>Waterloo Wind Farm Update – Mike Clee</p> <p>Transfer of Management Announcement</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> MC announced that as from 1 September 2017 the asset management of Waterloo Wind Farm will transfer from EnergyAustralia (EA) to Palisade Asset Management. As responsibility for operation and maintenance changes hands the wind farm will continue to uphold a rigorous approach to safety and compliance. Palisade Asset Management is committed to maintaining strong relations with the Mid North community and will continue to consult local stakeholders via the CLG and other forums. The annual Waterloo Wind Farm Community Fund will continue to support local initiatives that benefit the community. EnergyAustralia will continue to support Waterloo Wind Farm and ensure its ongoing viability through a long term agreement to purchase 50% of all energy generated by Stage 1 of the wind farm. SB – EA are ceasing operation of Waterloo Wind Farm and this will be taken over by Palisade. Hannah Willson will now work for Palisade along with Clint Purkiss and Gyorgyi Danka. SB formally thanked Mike Clee and EA for managing the Waterloo Wind Farm over the years. <p>Operations Report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> MC reported a satisfactory safety performance with no safety incidents for the quarter. Total Generation (12.8% below Target) was impacted due to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> WTG 'FF' Generator failure – Generator changed out Main incomer termination failure – replaced Proactive shutdown of the wind farm to assist the CFS with aerial water bombing to fight the January 2017 bushfire WTG 'CC' Generator bearing failure – Generator changed out Planned Outage (10 days working 24/7) to replace all transformer cables, as well as all cable joints on 'A' and 'D' circuits. This planned work was timed to coincide with low wind periods and the least impact to the local farming community. 6.	SA System Black Power Failure and AEMO Recommendations - Steve Brown	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● SB provided an enlightening overview of the reasons for the SA state-wide power outage that occurred on Wednesday, 28 September 2016 and provided an overview of AEMO's fourth and final incident report and recommendations. ● AEMO's Report, dated 28 March 2017, can be viewed on AEMO's website: www.aemo.com.au ● SB discussed: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ What happened on 28 September 2016 and how the network was impacted; ○ AEMO's Actions following 28 September 2016 event; ○ What happened when SA faced a further power outage on 3 March 2017; ○ AEMO's Actions following 3 March 2017 event; and ○ AEMO's Final Report and 19 recommendations. ● SB summarised by saying that, as a result of power outage events, the SA electricity system is in better shape than it was on 28 September 2016. AEMO are more aware of what can go wrong and have taken steps to avoid a repetition. These steps include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Wind Turbine protection ○ Forecasting ○ Synchronous generation ○ Interconnector protection settings ○ System restart ● SB sees a need for more work to be done on system stability. ● SB explained that he and Clint are involved in a number of renewable projects that relate to improving stability.
